# NAR Article

## AACA / NAR's First AACA Nationals

On the eve of our 2024 Fall Nationals, I thought it would be fun to have a look at the very first National Meet hosted by NAR, on 28 August 1966.

I have a few related documents that were passed down to me from various sources. Let's look at a few details surrounding that history-making show.

### Background

Recall that the Huntsville Antique Auto Club (formed in 1961) successfully applied to become an AACA region in late 1962, thus becoming our beloved NAR-AACA. The best I can tell, NAR then held local shows for a couple of years.

Skipping ahead to early September 1965, NAR Director (*i.e., Region President*) Dennis McCann received a letter from AACA National Board member Donald Anderson of Murfreesboro, Tennessee, explaining that AACA had been sponsoring Divisional National Meets, also since 1961, and inviting NAR to host such a meet. NAR was in the Central Division at that time—the meet would be the tenth in the Division, the first for NAR, and the first in Alabama:

After a couple of weeks of discussion among NAR members, Dennis sent a letter back to Mr. Anderson, accepting on behalf of the Board, the invitation to host a Nationals in August 1966, almost a year later:

Brochures announcing each meet are sent to all active members of AACA. Past divisional national meets indicate that members within a radius of 750 miles will attend these meets competing for national honors and national trophies. This is desired as it allows many AACA members to participate in national meets. Todate there have been ten national meets in the Central Division. Would your region consider sponsoring a Central Division meet in the fall of 1966? A meet of seventy-five to one hundred cars would be enough for a good show. Considering the 750 mile radius you would draw cars from about eighteen to twenty regions and chapters. I will be glad to give you full information, suggestions, and do what I can from this end to enable you to plan the meet effectively. All trophies, car identification cards, and the announcement brochures with attached registration forms, are supplied by the national office, from copy supplied by the sponsoring region. Please advise as to whether your region would accept this invitation to host such a meet in your area. Sincerely, Wend M. Anderow Donald<sup>3</sup>M. Anderson Member, Nat'l Board of Directors

After a couple of weeks of discussion among NAR members, Dennis sent a letter back to Mr. Anderson, accepting on behalf of the Board, the invitation to host a Nationals in August 1966, almost a year later:

#### Dear Don, We are in receipt of your September 8, 1965 letter, inviting us to host a national AACA fall meet next year. We are pleased and honored that you have enough faith in our club to offer such an opportunity to us. The Board of Directors and membership of the North Alabama Region will accept your invitation to host a national meet in lieu of, or in conjunction with, our fall meet next August. The weekend of August 22, 1966, or August 29, 1966, appears to be the most desireous because of the early return to school in the southern states.

### The Show

I don't have any record of the planning work that went into the Meet, but the results were remarkably similar to that of our present Nationals, including:

- Show Program
- Flea market
- Registration at the host hotel
- Tours to the Space and Rocket Center
- Hospitality party
- Judging
- Awards banquet

I say, stick with what works, even after fifty-eight years.

Mr. Anderson's letter suggests that AACA members are generally willing to travel 750 miles to participate in a show, and that 75 to 100 vehicles registered would be enough for a good show. This radius would have encompassed approximately twenty Regions and Chapters. So how did we do?

We don't have information on what Regions and Chapters were represented, but participants came from the eleven states highlighted here:

### States Entries

- Alabama
- Florida
- Georgia
- Indiana
- Kentucky
- Michigan
- Mississippi
- North Carolina
- Ohio
- Pennsylvania
- Tennessee

Ninety-six total entries. How did Tennessee come to provide more vehicles than Alabama? All the Alabama entries came from Huntsville, Decatur and Florence, except one from Fairfield (Birmingham area).





What about the makeup of the cars themselves? Recall that AACA had not yet adopted the 25-years-old qualification rule, and production cars and commercial vehicles were accepted only thought 1935. Classic cars were accepted up through 1948, in line with the acceptance criteria of the Classic Car Club of America. That said, the newest cars registered were a 1941 Packard and 1941 Cadillac. The oldest was an 1899 Stanley Steamer, followed by two 1903 Oldsmobile's and a 1903 Knox. Twenty-seven of the total were Ford Model T's and A's. Chevrolet, Buick, Reo, Dodge, Metz, Pierce Arrow, Star, Hanover, Hudson, Liberty, Jordan, Essex, Rolls Royce, Franklin, Auburn, LaSalle, Morgan, Brewster, and American LaFrance rounded out the Official Entry List.





Following the Saturday morning Judges breakfast, vehicle judging will commence promptly at 11:00 a.m. All vehicles must remain on the show field until the end of judging, which will be approximately 3:00 p.m. or until released by the Chief Judge.
