

Did You Know?

- Registration is now open online at aaca.org; select the AACA Member Login tab; enter your member # & PIN; select Meet Pre-registration; click on Southeastern Fall Nationals and Register for the events you will be attending. After completion, you will have an option to pay your registration fees with a credit card. If you can't access the online registration, call headquarters at (717) 534-1910 to request a hardcopy Registration card for you to complete. Complete the form and mail with a check for your fees to the address listed.
- Any AACA member can become an AACA Judge. First time judges must attend a Judges' School, Judges' Breakfast and will judge Drivers Participation Class (DPC) vehicles on the show field. NAR will be hosting a Judges' School on Friday from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. and Judges' Breakfast on Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 9:15 a.m.. The only cost to become a Judge is the \$10 fee for the Judges' Breakfast. To register to be a judge, log onto aaca.org; AACA Member Login; enter member # & PIN; select Judges Pre-registration; select our event Southeastern Fall Nationals and select Register and then complete the Registration Form.
 - Historical Preservation of Original Features (HPOF) Vehicles in this class will depict vehicles that display originality over restoration. This class allows us to see history and to display collector vehicles in their original, manufactured condition. Vehicles in this class are commonly referred to as a 'survivors'. Vehicles in this class will NOT be point judged but 'evaluated'. See Judging Guidelines, Section 3 Appendix 3-10 & 3-11 for HPOF Certification Forms. A vehicle having achieved the HPOF certification award is eligible to be evaluated for the AACA Original award at a subsequent Nationals.
- No vehicle will be allowed on the show field without being pre-registered. All vehicles will be given an identification card for the vehicle's windshield. The card will be included inside of the entrant's registration folder.
- Saturday, October 26th, judging will commence at 11:00 a.m.. All entrants arriving after 11:00 a.m., without just cause, will be allowed to enter the show field but will be disqualified from judging. All vehicles shall remain on the show field until 3:00 p.m. or released by the Chief Judge.
- The Indigo Hotel has been added as an additional hotel available for Nationals participants. The hotel is the new hotel being constructed, just north and within close walking distance of the amphitheater. Rate is \$199+tax including breakfast, king bed, 2 persons. Call (256) 843-0305 to make your reservation.


Alabama's Historic Byler Road / Alabama's First Public Road

Byler Road is the oldest public road in Alabama still in use today. Constructed in the mid-1820s, it connected Courtland, near the Tennessee River, with Tuscaloosa, near the Black Warrior River.

Byler Road was named for Captain John Byler, who served in Andrew Jackson's army at the Battle of Horseshoe Bend. On December 16th, 1819, Alabama Governor William W. Bibb signed a bill authorizing Byler and his associates to construct a toll road that would link the Tennessee Valley with the Black Warrior River. Byler would be allowed to keep the tolls from the road for twelve years as long as the road was maintained. The road's northern starting point began at Jackson's Military Road in Lauderdale County. Private investors funded much of the road's construction as the road would allow cotton to be transported from the Tennessee River to the Black Warrior River, then onward to the port at Mobile and Europe. Up to 25 stands were created along the road's length, providing lodging and meals to travelers.

The road spurred development in Lawrence, Winston, Walker, and Fayette counties, and was traveled by both Union and Confederate armies during the Civil War. A half-mile section of the road in Tuscaloosa County was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1974.


In 2024, the state of Alabama began adding historic markers along the route of Byler Road.

AACA Awards 101

Are you mystified by the AACA awards program? It is not that complicated. A great seminar on the subject was recently presented at the Central Spring Meet in Independence, MO. The awards follow the life cycle of our vehicles. HPOF or Historic Preservation of Original Features is an evaluated class for survivor vehicles relatively unchanged from when they were new, first receiving the HPOF badge. After receiving the HPOF certification the vehicle is evaluated for Original status, which receives the Original Tab. Later in the life cycle, the vehicles become drivers with changes along the way such as radial tires instead of bias, newer radios and the like, but with major things like engines still correct but maybe rebuilt or upgraded. These are DPC or Driver Participation Class vehicles which are evaluated, not point judged, and receive a DPC badge. Both of these classes receive participation to get back to the level of when they were received by the dealer from the factory. These vehicles then come into the point judging classes.

All vehicles must arrive on the judging field under their own power and start out with 400 points. Authenticity is the key, with Condition and Workmanship also part of the deductions from 400 points. Vehicles enter at the Junior level and proceed upwards toward the Senior and Grand National levels. Details are found in the Official Judging Guidelines Manual and are presented also in Judging Schools. Preservation awards are given once the Senior level is attained and the vehicles are shown at National Meets.

There are national awards presented at the Annual Meeting in Philadelphia in various categories each year. Every vehicle shown at a National Meet or Tour is looked at by the National Awards Team (the folks in the yellow shirts with lots of judging credits). Nominations are made by the team during the year, owners are notified later in the year and they decide if they want to be considered. The team meets in Hershey in early December and picks the winners for presentation at the Annual Meeting.

That's how simple the whole process is. Join the fun at the next National Meet in your area.
